#### **PLUS Loan Credit Counseling**

<u>PLUS Loan Credit Counseling</u> can help students and parents understand the obligations associated with a PLUS loan and what to consider when taking on student loan debt.

PLUS counseling can be required or voluntary. If you voluntarily pursue counseling and the U.S. Department of Education (ED) determines your credit history is adverse within 30 days of completion, your counseling requirement is fulfilled. Colleges and career schools use the FAFSA form to determine how much financial aid your student is eligible to receive, which could include grants, scholarships, and loans. While the window for completion does not open until December 1st, creation of your FSA ID can be done ahead of time and a FAFSA checklist is available for reference.

- \*Michigan Achievement Scholarships: These scholarships are designed to help recent high school graduates in Michigan receive funds for continuing education. Eligible students could receive financial aid to attend a college or university with the Michigan Achievement Scholarship, or for a career training program with the Michigan Achievement Skills Scholarship.
